April 2009

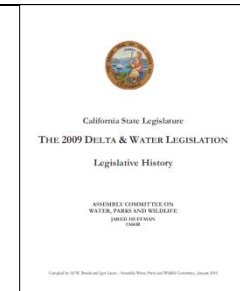
Draft 20x2020 Water Conservation Plan released by interagency team formed by the Administration



November 2009

SBx7-7 signed

- Part of 5 bill legislative package
- Provisions for agricultural and urban water conservation

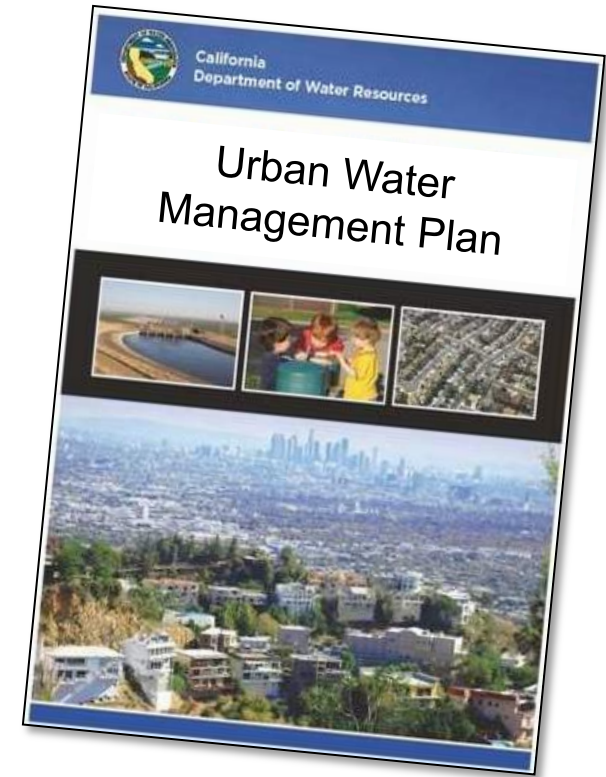

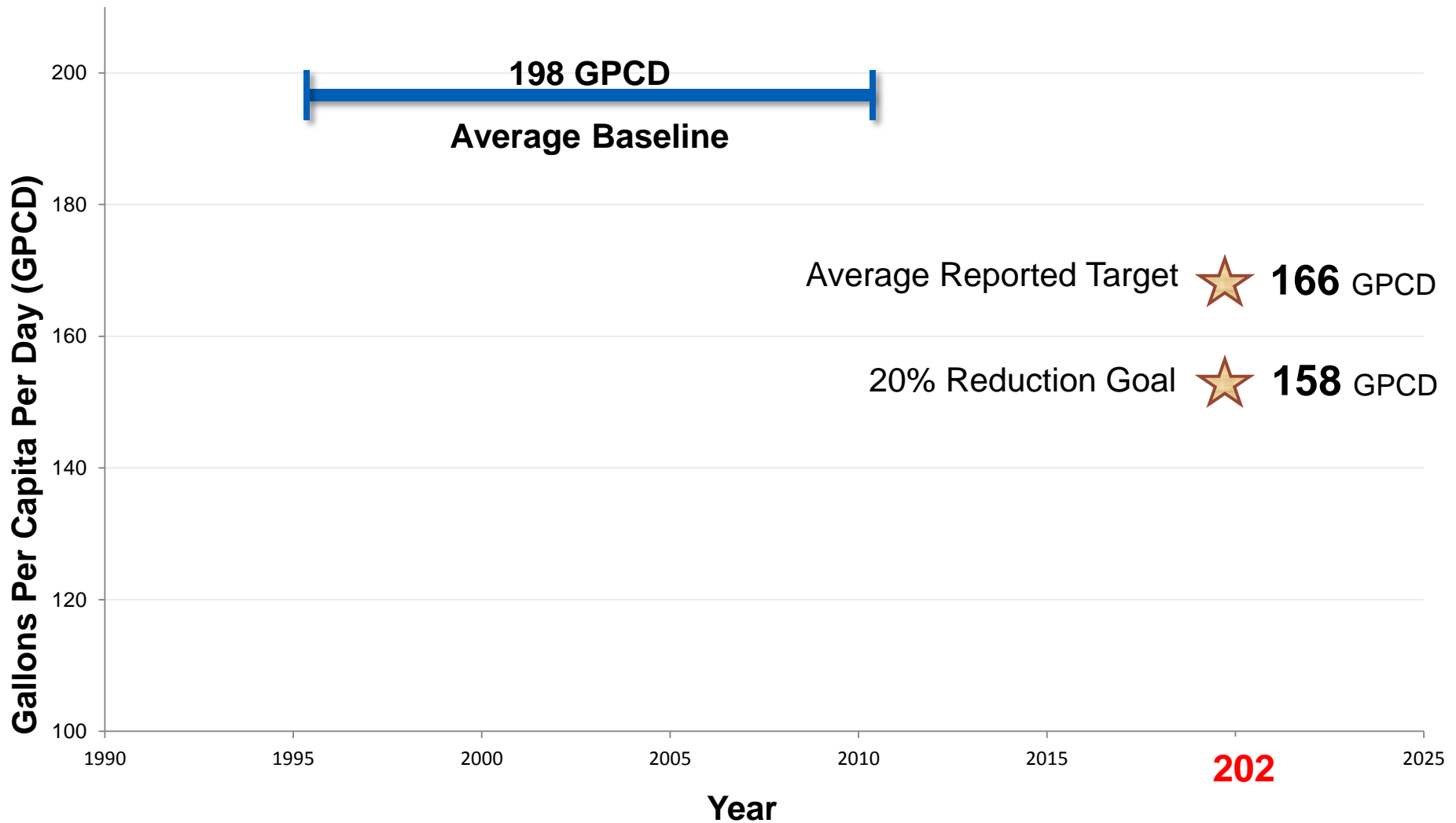

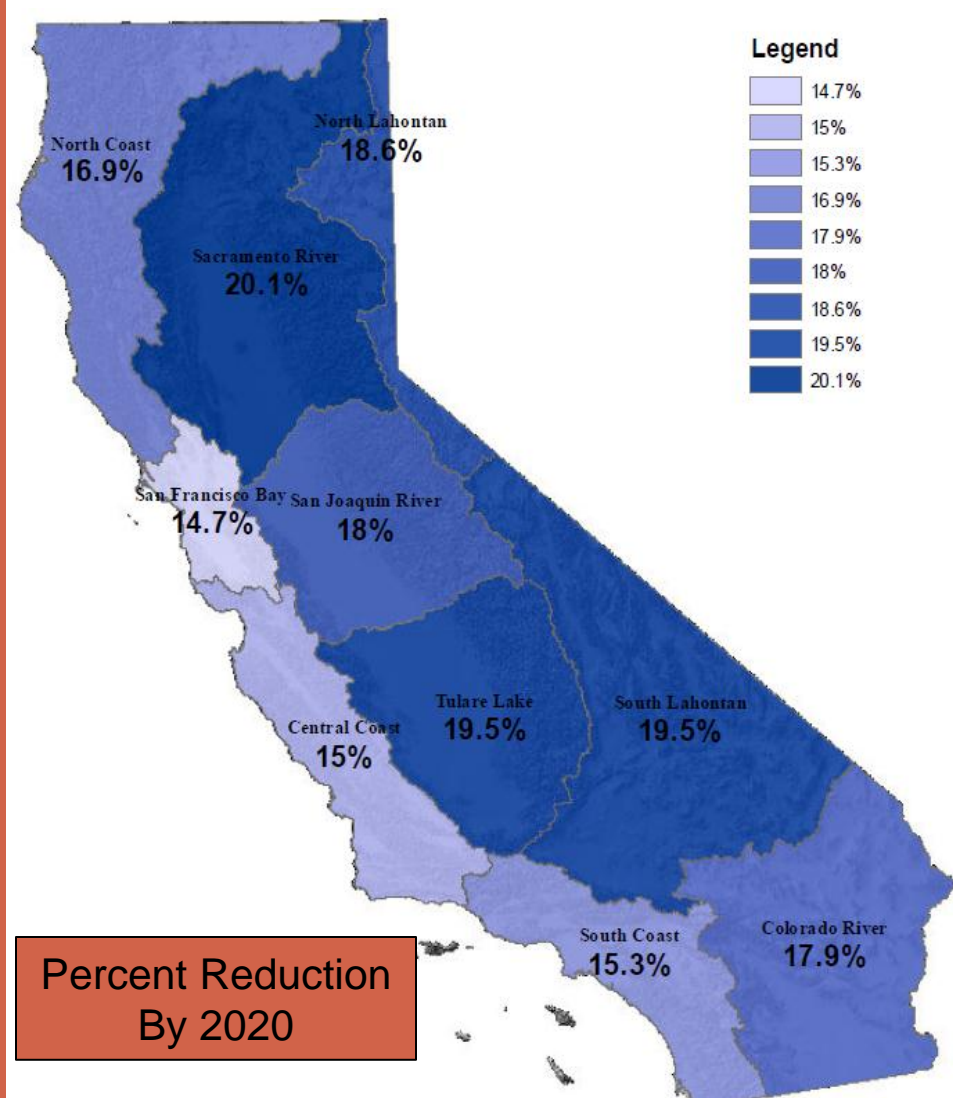
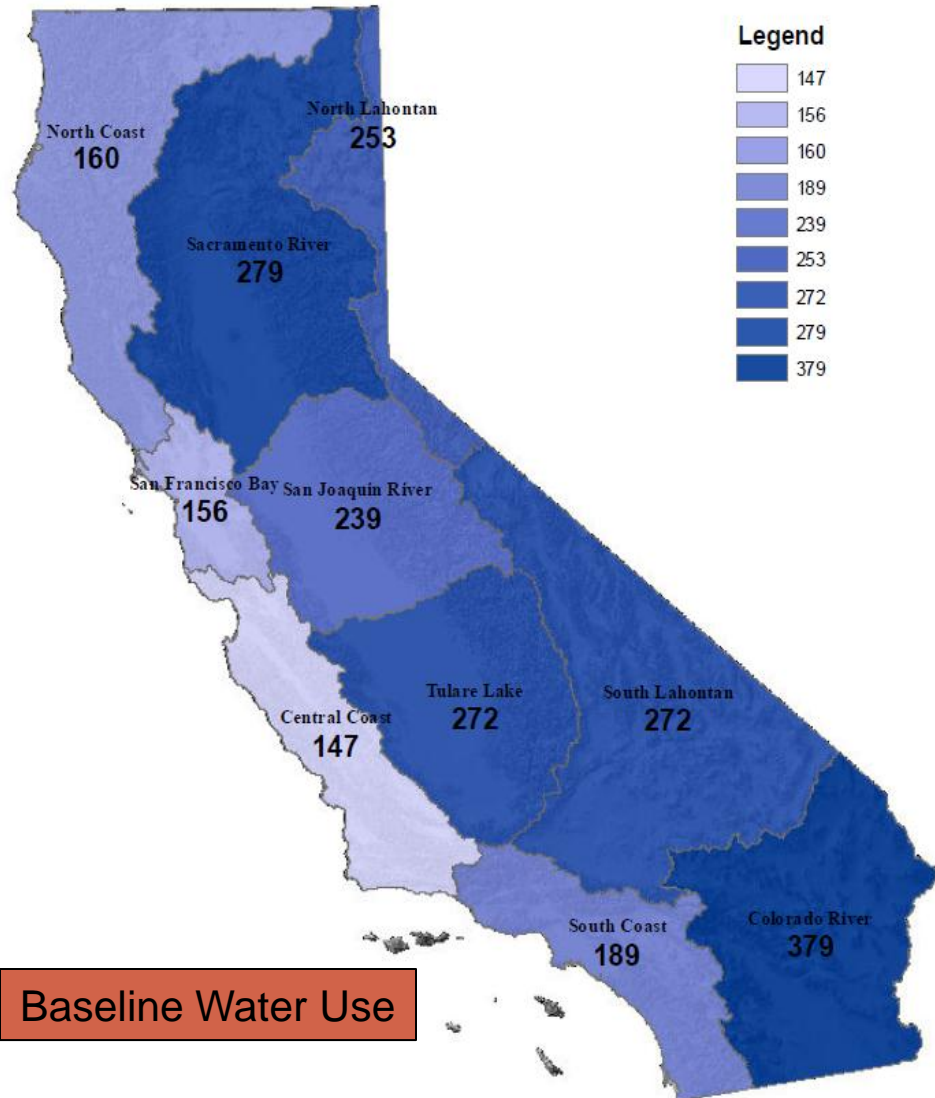

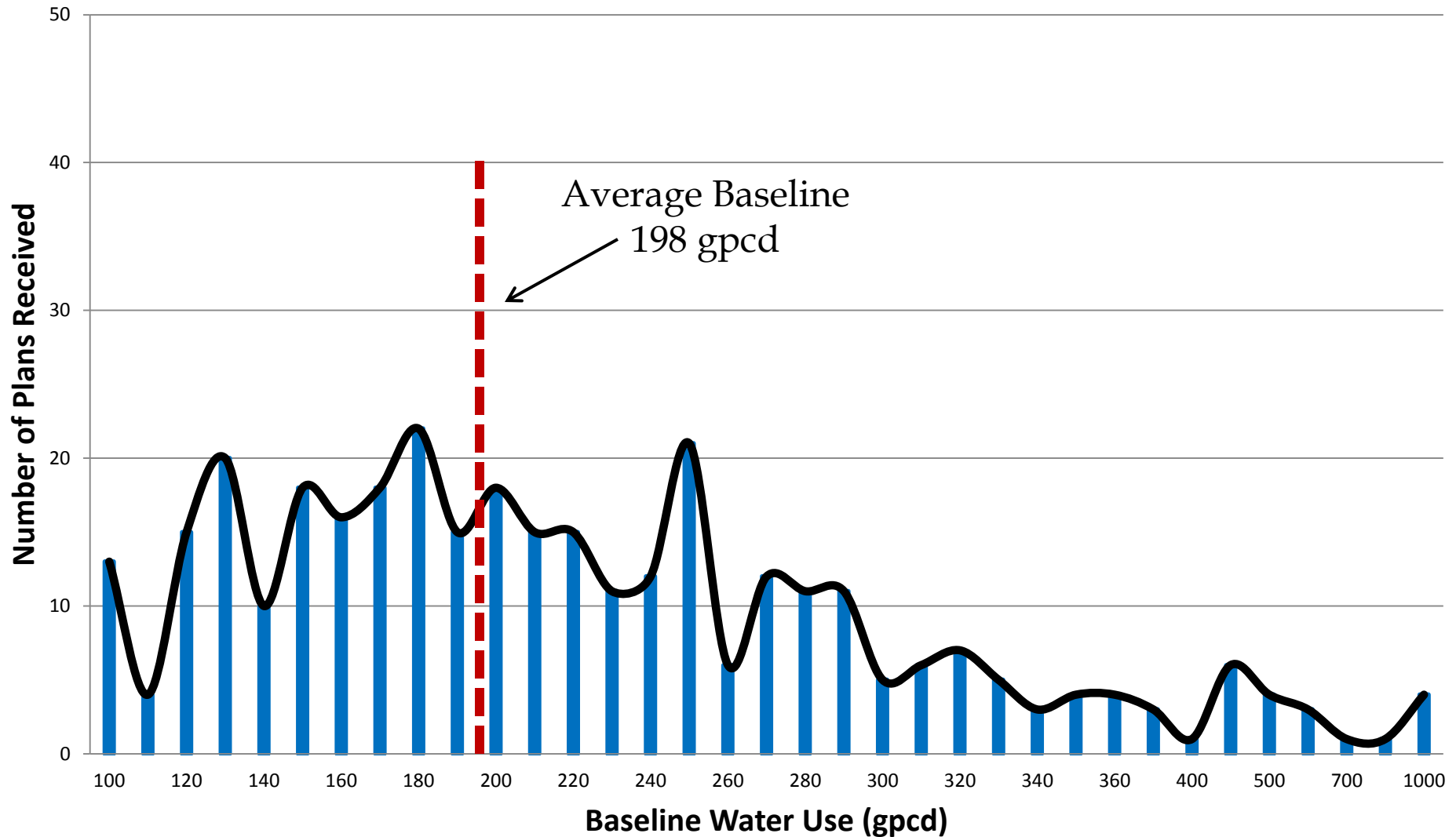
Statewide Average Baseline and Targets
